David Holt's State Senate Campaign Tops \$100,000 in Fundraising

With nine months to go before the 2010 primary, the State Senate campaign of conservative Republican David Holt reported today to the Oklahoma Ethics Commission that it had raised \$103,433.33 for the campaign, with over \$90,000 in "cash on hand." The donations came from 292 donors. The total does not include donations made after September 30. The campaign accepted \$47,768.33 in the third quarter.

"We are truly humbled by the support we have received for this endeavor," said Holt. "It has overwhelmed us, and we are so grateful to our friends and neighbors for believing in this campaign. There is nothing more humbling than to have a community of people that have made you who you are express through their donations their hope that you will now represent them. That trust means the word to me."

In addition to financial support, the campaign has signed up hundreds of volunteers, and thousands of voters have visited the online campaign headquarters at www.VoteDavidHolt.com. The campaign has received hundreds of endorsements and expressions of support from every precinct in the district.

"It's critical that we have the resources to get our message out, but more important than that is making a connection with every voter, and hearing what's important to our families in this community," said Holt. "We are mounting one of the most thoughtful and thorough grassroots efforts this area has ever seen. This campaign starts on every doorstep in this district, and that's where we're taking it. As I make my way around this community that I've called home my entire life, I'm hearing that we want our next Senator to represent our conservative values, as only someone who is one of us could."

David's conservative values, heart for service, experience, and roots in this community make him uniquely qualified to be the next State Senator from District

30. He is seeking the open State Senate seat currently held by Senate President Pro-Tempore Glenn Coffee, who is term-limited in 2010. The district covers parts of Northwest Oklahoma City, Bethany, Warr Acres, and The Village.

David was raised in the Northwest Oklahoma City community. The son of a retired Putnam City schoolteacher, David attended Putnam City schools from kindergarten through graduation. He has been married to Rachel for over six years, and they are expecting their first child in December. David and Rachel are active members of St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral. David serves as a member of the Oklahoma County Republican Party Executive Committee, on the boards of the Northwest Chamber and the Putnam City Schools Foundation, and is active in numerous other community organizations. He currently serves as chief of staff to Oklahoma City Mayor Mick Cornett, previously served in the White House of President George W. Bush, under U.S. House Speaker Dennis Hastert and Lt. Governor Mary Fallin, and several members of Congress from Oklahoma.
